INTERPRETER EDUCATION PROGRAM (IEP): ESC - Interpreting in Medical Settings

MARKETING: Certificate – Entrepreneurship

PARALEGAL/LEGAL ASSISTANT: Certificate - Level II - Paralegal General

PASTRY ARTS: Certificate - Advanced Pastry Arts

POLICE ACADEMY: Certificate - Basic Peace Officer

PHOTOGRAPHY: (pending THECB recognition for Spring 2017) AAS - Photography; Certificate – Commercial Photography

The Core Curriculum: The core curriculum also had a few changes approved by the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board. Under the Component Area Option portion of the Core Curriculum, EDUC 1200-Learning Framework was deleted. Also under the Option Area, EDUC 1300-Learning Framework and PHED 1338-Concepts of Physical Fitness were added.

Non-credit Coursework
