About

- The six basic elements of making content accessible
- SCULPT: Structure, Color contrast, Use of images, Links, Plain English, Table Structure

Structure:

- Use built-in heading styles
- · Allows those with visual impairments to navigate document

Colour Contrast

- Use a strong colour contrast between text and background
- · Allows those with visual impairments to perceive the content

Use of Images

- Use alt text to describe the image
- Allows those with visual impairments to read the visual

Links

- Name hyperlinks clearly and accurately
- Allows those with visual impairments to know which websites to access

Plain English

- Write with the audience in mind
- Allows those with limited English proficiency or cognitive disabilities to understand the content

Table Structure

- Use a simple table structure
- Allows those with visual impairments to read the table with a screenreader
