

The Student Leadership Academy (SLA) is a nine-month three credit hour course (SPCH2333) designed to promote leadership practices that foster teamwork and integrity in personal and professional development through scholarship and

service.

WHO: Students that have at least a 2.5 GPA, six completed college credit hours, and a

application.

WHEN: The SLA will consist of ten meetings over two semesters. The academy will meet
