Elaine Boski-Wilkinson said she has met with PR about designing a campaign for advertising Child Development courses.

No Child Left Behind

Brenda Kihl stated that paraprofessionals must have 1-2 year degree and must be trained to help the teacher in Reading, Writing and Math. Brenda addresses what was needed and said she has programs she and Elaine Boski-Wilkinson had designed. We are working with Plano now and they require 48 hours.

Cathy Gaines, Prosper ISD, stated they are not yet addressing the needs for paraprofessional training, because they are not a Title I school.

LeAnn Kite stated that if the state receives Title I funds all schools will need training.

Kelly Meyers said Allen has only one paraprofessional at this time.

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Rose Oliphant stated she is seeing more teachers that can't spell, read or write properly and has to redo accident reports due to this.

Elaine-Boski-Wilkinson stated that she is also having problems with students struggling with grammar and spelling.

Katherine Lunde asked if it should be a necessity that we recommend course of literacy.

Robin Brown said she is seeing very different outcomes or goals from students and their level of literacy.

Elaine-Boski-Wilkinson asked ISD's if they are seeing literacy as a challenge at their schools.

Brenda Askew said she is seeing lots of errors teacher are making.

Jo Howser said she is also seeing lots of teachers making mistakes with spelling.

Katherine Lunde stated that students coming to CCCCD looking for betterment and she thinks CCCCD is demanding excellence in students.

Elaine Boski-Wilkinson said she would look at ways to address this problem

Brenda Kihl said she would put together skills test for paraprofessionals.

Mack Standlee moved that Elaine Boski-Wilkinson would come back with ways to address this problem. Rose Oliphant seconded the motion.

Teacher Assistant Specialization

Elaine Boski-Wilkinson asked if this is worthwhile.

Kelly Meyers stated said it would be good if it said Highly Qualified.

Sandy Gorham agreed that it would be highly needed.

Cathy Gaines asked if there is anything more geared to 4-12.

Brenda Kihl said that EDTC has some courses but we haven't needed them and therefore haven't offered them. Brenda also stated that certification has to be approved one year in advance and could not be offered before next fall.

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Elaine Boski-Wilkinson will take motion to take the certification to board for approval.

Robin Brown moved the motion and Mack Standlee seconded the motion.
