Price stated that Don Abbott is a good contact and that Raytheon/TI might contribute the computer simulator.  Price stated that maybe we can get some grant money if we offer the IMS training. Price stated that Steve Deffibaugh has been given grants to provide Hazmat Training.  Price also stated that he would like for the Fire Science Department to offer ISO Classes off site.  Bob Acker would like the Fire Science Department to offer Fire Officer I, II, III and IV.  Pat McAuliff stated that he would see about offering the Fire Officer II & IV as Continuing Education Classes and keep Fire Officer I & II as credit classes.  Bob would like to see the Fire Science Department to offer the Hazmat classes and add more Hazmat props. The demand for these classes is there because of the Homeland Security effort throughout the US. Along with more Hazmat classes he would like for us to host a day seminar of First Responder to Terrorism course. He stated that there could be grant money from the National Response Plan.  Pat McAuliff will check to see if there is a canned program available to buy for terrorism classes.  Bob suggested looking in the Homeland Security Professional magazine. He suggested that we get permission to have access to the airways for our Motorola radios so that we could use Collin County College in case of a terrorism disaster.  Bob Acker also stated that he would like to see the Fire Science Department to host a Collin County explorer day.
