## Developmental Education Courses

Developmental education courses provide students with the basic skills and self-confidence needed to successfully complete college-level work. Courses are offered in English as a Second Language (ESL), mathematics, reading and writing in various instructional formats, including individualized, web-based, computer-based, self-paced or lecture classes and telecourses.

If the basic skills assessment score indicates an individual needs extra preparation for college-level courses, enrollment in developmental courses is mandatory. Students who do not successfully complete any portion of the Texas Higher Education Assessment (THEA) test must be enrolled in a developmental course.

### DEVELOPMENTAL MATHEMATICS

Understanding math is the key to alleviating math anxiety and improving math skills. We offer six developmental math courses:

- Introductory Geometry (0115)
- Beginning Algebra (0305)
- Basic Math (0300)
- Intermediate Algebra (0310)
- Pre-Algebra (0302)
- Math Study Skills (0320)

*This course is for enrichment and is not required in the developmental math course sequence.*

### DEVELOPMENTAL READING

Strong reading skills are essential for success in college. In the reading program, you will learn the strategies necessary for understanding and remembering what you read in textbooks.

Reading 0300, 0305, 0310 and 1300 are designed to meet individualized needs.

### DEVELOPMENTAL WRITING

Developmental Writing 0300, 0305, 0310 and 0315 are designed to help refresh your grammar skills, increase your communication skills, or prepare for college-level writing.

### ENGLISH AS A SECOND LANGUAGE (ESL)

If English is not your first language, we have a program that can assist you.

- ESL Listening/Conversation
- ESL Reading
- ESL Grammar
- ESL Writing

### STUDY SKILLS SEMINARS
