SUGGESTIONS TO MAKE A SUCCESSFUL TRANSFER

- Housing application (if living on campus)
- Keep detailed records, names of contacts made, and copies of documents sent to colleges or universities.
- Maintain a high grade point average, especially for your first semester. A minimum GPA of 2.0 is required for admission at most colleges.
- Be aware of deadlines and fees.
- Resist the urge to carry too many credit hours during the first semester, especially if you are going to be working.
- Join an organization that sounds interesting to you and enjoy the fun.
- Enjoy the journey. If you start early, keep your goals in mind, and follow these hints and suggestions; you will manage your transfer successfully.

Once you have decided where you want to transfer and what you want to accomplish there:

- Apply early. Many colleges and universities require your application six to nine months prior to your date of enrollment.
- Meet with your CCCCD academic advisor and make contact with an advisor/liaison at your prospective college or university to ensure a smooth transfer.
- Start applying early and meet all deadlines for institutional, departmental, and private scholarships.
- Attend student orientation or information sessions offered by the college or university.

CHECK DEGREE REQUIREMENTS

Transfer of credit (core courses, fields of study, and pre-professional requirements) from CCCCD to a college or university can be a very simple process. Be aware, however, that each college and university determines which courses will be required for graduation in a particular degree. Not all transferable courses can be used toward a specific degree. Some courses are designed for job entry and career preparation and may not transfer.

DOCUMENTS FOR TRANSFER TO A COLLEGE OR UNIVERSITY INCLUDE:

- Admission application and fees
- Transcripts from all institutions attended submitted directly to admissions
- High school transcript (if needed)
- SAT/ACT scores (if needed)
- Financial aid forms and documentation (if needed)
- Housing application (if living on campus)
