Spectrum Student Ambassadors for Diversity is a group of students who represent CCCCD at various campus and community events. They provide campus tours and welcome all new students during phone bank. Special Admissions, Special admission is offered to high school students who have advanced ability and request early admissions consideration, students under 18 years of age without a high school diploma or the equivalent, and home schooled

students under the age of 18. Juniors may take one college course per semester and seniors may take two courses per semester. However, both juniors and seniors are limited to one course per five-week summer session. Students interested in this program should visit with their high school counselor who will decide which college courses are accepted and whether or not the courses may be taken for dual credit or early admissions.
