Hi All,

re the direction for students to not use their phone for accessing course content:

I've checked with the Instructional Designers and looked through the eLC Daily Log and we do not have recollection nor record of this kind of issue. That certainly doesn't mean it doesn't exist. I will send out an email to faculty and deans next week reiterating the difference between content created in Canvas vs other tools. I will also provide them a survey and ask them to request their students provide feedback: We will be asking if they've submitted assignments using their phones, if they've had problems, etc. If any faculty are having issues like this, I'll also encourage faculty to make an appointment with an eLC staff member to test things out and troubleshoot. Last, we will send an email to all publishers faculty are currently using and ask for a response re any potential issues or warnings re the use of cell phones. We'll share that data as soon as we have it.

re any requirements of providing closed caption for live-streams:

It continues to be pretty ambiguous. I had my iTechs check into this. To our knowledge, there is no current set requirements aside for live-stream events other than "make your best efforts", but there are many active lawsuits going to court as we speak because of the ambiguous nature of it.
