Recommendation discussion (list all new programs or program changes discussed):

Curriculum Proposals

- **Nursing**
 - RN to BSN Program, entirely online
 - Ensuring all prerequisites are offered online
 - Removed some clinical requirements
 - Added professional project that is a practicum to cover clinical requirements
 - Encouraging students to be core-complete before starting the program
 - Dr. Smith motioned to approve. Dr. Corwin seconded. Unanimous approval.
- **Cloud Computing**
 - Change of generic capstone course to a specific course for cloud computing
 - Local needs course that includes lab
 - Reworked curriculum for the capstone
 - Added prerequisites to the second year of the program to ensure curriculum aligns to Amazon Web Services Certifications
 - Prerequisite courses are what are recommended to take during the first year of the program
 - Will go into effect Fall 2023
 - Dr. Mesch motioned to approve. Dr. Leverette seconded. Unanimous approval.
- **Physical Therapist Assistant (PTA)**
 - Program has not yet started, starting Fall 2023
 - Changing sequence of courses
 - Removed courses and added courses for accreditation requirements
 - Changes recommended by accreditation consultant
 - Anticipate accreditation visit in Spring 2023
 - Removing clinical and replacing with practicum
 - For Occupational Skills Award, removed courses that are not part of accreditation and added courses that are required for accreditation
 - Dr. Smith motioned to approve. Dr. Mesch seconded. Unanimous approval.

Expedited Proposals

- Diagnostic Medical Sonography
 - Statement of math course required higher than algebra no longer required by revised accreditation requirements
 - Opened up opportunities to allow other math courses
 - Dr. Smith motioned to approve. Dr. McRae seconded. Unanimous approval.
- Kinesiology
 - Adjusting course title and course description to align with ACGM, also adjusted SLOs
 - Dr. McRae motioned to approve. Dr. Mesch seconded. Unanimous approval.
- LVN to RN
 - SLOs were updated to remove redundancy
 - Removed Collin outcomes
 - Contact hours were increased
 - Courses were changed from being listed as a lecture course to a lab course
 - Adjusted prerequisites and corequisites
 - All changes align with move to 8-week sessions
 - Dr. Smith motioned to approve. Dr. McRae seconded. Unanimous approval.

Information Report

- Sport Recreation Management
 - Revisiting from November meeting with Andrea Szlachtowski and Michele Culpepper
 - Courses are built to be transferable to our institutions, specifically UNT BAS; other universities are in conversation
 - Job possibilities
 - EQ report on career possibilities didn't pull parks and recreation jobs. This program allows for entry into entry-level management positions with Parks and Rec.
 - Texas Recreation and Parks Society will partner with Collin so that these students can volunteer with them and potentially get entry-level management positions.
 - Enrollment numbers – as of Fall 2022, 174 students (unduplicated); 2022 academic year ended with 186 students
 - First 3 certificate completers happening today at graduation, first AAS students will complete in Spring 2023
 - Job opportunities within service area and 3-5 year projection
 - Total demand is 261 jobs locally
 - Expecting 1,200 jobs within the next 10 years
 - Student perceptions – academic vs workforce
 - Students taking these courses to go straight into the workforce
 - A few are looking at transferring to a BAS program and are informed about possibilities
 - Possibilities for 2+2 program
 - UNT Frisco offers sports management entertainment program
 - Not viable for 2+2 program due to workforce alignment

- Can revisit, but need to keep Sport Recreation Management separate from Sports Management
- Status of UNT Frisco BAS
 - Originally offered in Frisco, but now moved to the Denton campus
 - Students don't want to drive to Denton to complete the program
- Existing courses on transfer side that align with a greater number of schools, need to ensure doesn't cause conflicts
