

SmarterMeasure is a diagnostic assessment that quantifies a learner's readiness to learn based on non-cognitive success indicators. Educational institutions often embed this assessment as an 'Assignment' or 'Module' in the beginning of an orientation or student success course. Upon completion, students receive a score report with an interpretation guide.

To encourage students to read their score reports and reflect on their readiness, instructors often use discussion questions. These questions help students align course content with their personal experiences and insights, fostering reflection on their strengths and areas for improvement. This process not only deepens self-understanding but also promotes meaningful interactions among peers.

Share your strategies for planning and making the most of your available time.

Finding a Dedicated Place to Study – Choosing the right environment is crucial for effective studying. Describe some places available to you for studying and doing schoolwork. Look for locations that are as free from distractions as possible and allow you to focus for extended periods of time.

Reason for Continuing Your Education – Why are you pursuing your degree? Beyond just obtaining a diploma, consider how earning your degree will benefit you and those around you. Academic Attributes – Think about something valuable you learned in your past educational experiences. How can you apply this knowledge to help you succeed in college? Reviewing your SmarterMeasure report can also help you identify areas you may need to work on to achieve academic success.
