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General comments about the submission or rationale for the conclusion:

Lisa Reed – Program Report is responsive in each of the component areas. Considering the short length of time that the program has been offered at Collin College, it is impressive how well it stands up among the peer institutions' Video Production programs. Estimates for future growth of the program and the demand for more in the marketplace is impressive as it is covered in the Report. The recommendations made in this review primarily reflect areas which lack adequate evidence or a detailed way to support evidence offered. When these areas are addressed, the report will be more beneficial to students in the program, those considering it, faculty teaching in the program, and those working to advise students about the program.

Laura Varnell - Overall, the program review for Video Production well written and provides excellent information on the growth and success of the program. The program growth and demand are on track to continue as the marketplace continues to expand both locally and nationally. The areas of recommendation or change primarily reflect a need for more tangible or detailed evidence to support the associated Report criteria. In the area of communication, a focus on more digitally accessible information would be beneficial to reach prospective students who are exploring what the Collin College program has to offer against other local programs. While this will be addressed over time as the new website continues to be developed, we recommend providing a summary of actions or specific areas the program intends to target to ensure this information is better communicated.
