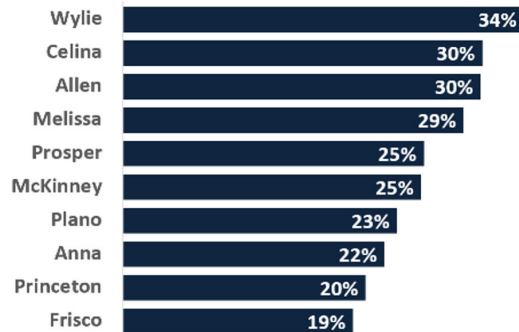

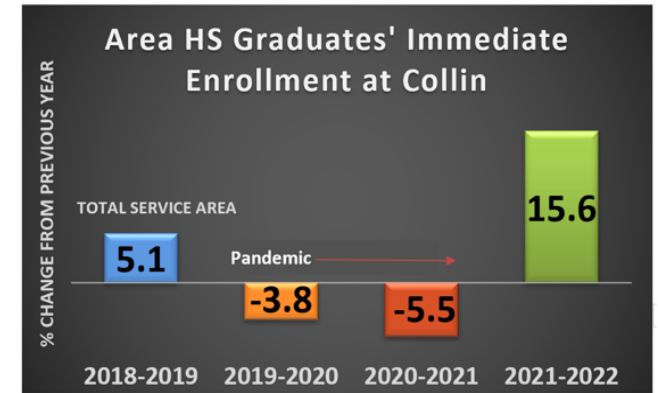


Figure 1. Percentage change in immediate enrollment at Collin from service area high school: 2018-2019 to 2021-2022

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POST-PANDEMIC IMMEDIATE ENROLLMENT: The area HS graduates' immediate enrollment at Collin (in Summer/Fall 2022) had a big jump following two continuous years of declining enrollments during the pandemic. The number of area HS graduates who enrolled at Collin increased from 3,801 in 2021 to 4,394 in 2022, a 15.6% increase (Figure 1). Collin attracted 22 percent of the graduates from its service area. Many institutions have been struggling to maintain enrollments and adopted long and short-term enrollment management strategies. Collin's efforts under the Cares Act's Funding encouraged the area high school graduates to enroll at Collin as it offered free classes for up to six credit hours in the summer of 2022. The advantages offered under the Cares Act Grant and the ebbing of COVID-19 resulted in a substantial increase in enrollment; there was a doubling of the area HS graduates' enrollment at Collin in the Summer of 2022. The percentage increase in immediate Summer/Fall 2022 enrollment at Collin stands in contrast to the declines in immediate enrollment at colleges nationally.

The National Student Clearing House Research Center's (NSCHRC) recent report (October 20, 2022) indicates that undergraduate enrollment continued to shrink in fall 2022 (-1.1%), however, the declines slowed compared to 2021 (-2.1%). Based on 10.3 million undergraduate and graduate students, the NSCHRC reports that the steepest declines in undergraduate enrollment are for 4-year private (-2.5%) and 4-year public (-1.6%). **The declines were much less for community colleges with only a 0.4% loss compared to the fall of 2021.** The NSCHRC suggests that the lower declines in community colleges could be because of the big increase in dual credit enrollment, and the increase (1.4%) in traditional-aged freshmen (18-20 years) which may have stabilized the immediate enrollment for community colleges. **Overall, immediate enrollment increased by 0.9% in community colleges (NSCHRC, 2022).** The 18-20 year age group would be reflective of the typical age of recent high school graduates. This may be an indicator that high school graduates found community college more valuable for their education/employment pursuits (Moreno et al., 2022).

According to National College Attainment Network (NCAN), compared to 2021, there is an increase in the number of students who submitted the Application for Federal Students Aid (FAFSA). Between October 1 and June 30, 2022, 52.1% of the high school seniors completed FAFSA. With the adoption of the universal FAFSA policy, Texas ranks first nationally in terms of the largest percentage change (25.9%) in FAFSA completion rates compared to 2021 (NCAN, 2022; Burt, 2022).

The 15.6% increase in immediate enrollment in Summer/Fall 2022 at Collin is substantially higher than that observed for community colleges reported by NCCHRC (0.9%). Collin appears to be doing better than the other 2-year colleges and its market penetration is moving closer to the pre-pandemic percentages. Collin may consider continuing its enrollment strategies to attract students.

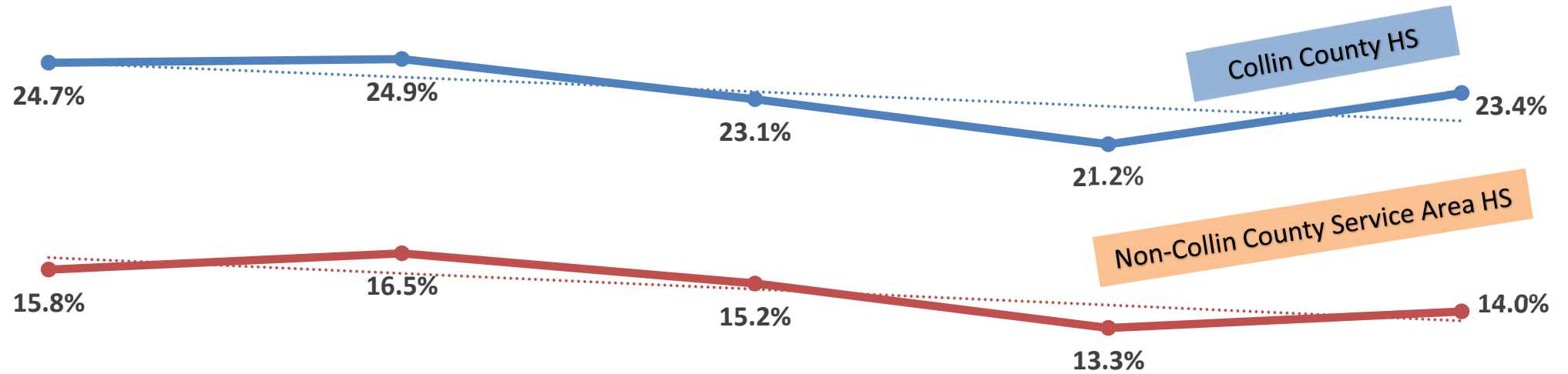

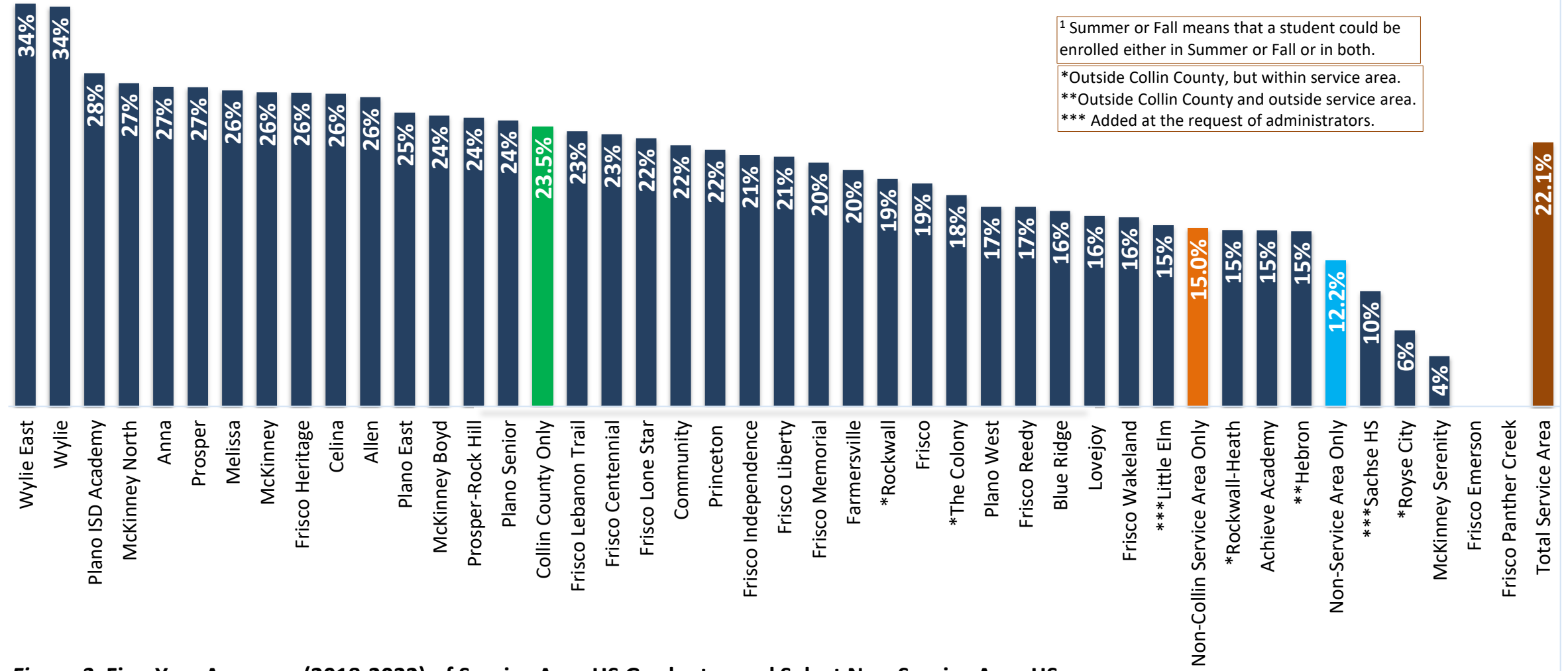
