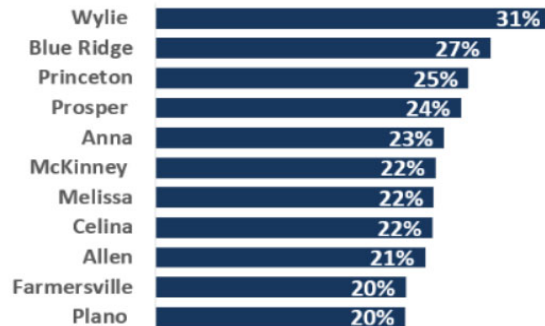

### IMPACT OF PANDEMIC

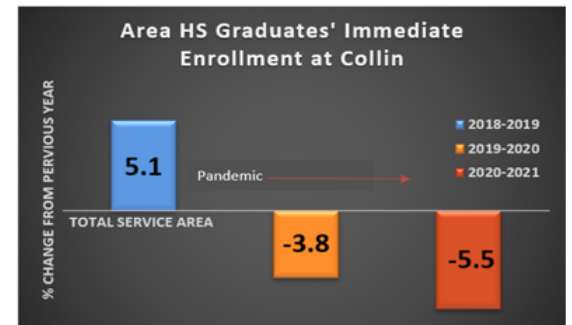


Figure 1. Percentage change in immediate enrollment at Collin from service area high schools: 208-2019 to 2020-2021

The immediate enrollment (Summer/Fall 2021) continues to decline in the second fall of the pandemic. Despite Collin opening its campuses, immediate enrollment for the graduating high school class of 2021 dropped. It dropped to 3,801 in 2021 from 4,024 in 2020, a 5.5% decrease (Figure 1). This contrasts with a 5% increase in fall 2019 when more graduates enrolled at Collin compared to 2018 (4,182 vs. 3,980). Research suggests that the declining trend in immediate Summer/Fall 2021 enrollment is in line with the impact of COVID-19 on colleges' enrollment nationally.

To investigate the continued impact of the pandemic on fall 2021 enrollments, a report released by the National Student Clearing House Research Center (NSCHRC), on October 21, 2021, indicates that undergraduate enrollment declined 3.5 percent from last fall whereas graduate enrollment grew 2.1 percent, maintaining the upward trend from last fall (+2.7%). **The 2-year public institutions had a decline of 6 percent in fall 2021.** Based on 13.7 million undergraduate and graduate students, the NSCHRC reports that the undergraduates continue to trend downwards with the highest drops for private for-profit (-8.5%) and public 2-year institutions (-6.0%). The NSCHRC indicates that the pandemic had a greater impact on the immediate enrollment of graduates from high poverty, low income, and urban high schools (NSCHRC, 2021).

A survey of 206 Admissions officers by Inside Higher Education states that three-quarters of the respondents feel that campus closures in fall 2020 impacted their recruitment by a moderate amount (38%) or a great deal (34%). Half of the respondents reported a change in the institutions' application processes to test-optional or test-blind. Analysis of Federal data by the National College Attainment Network indicates a drop in the financial aid (FAFSA) applications among the high school graduating class of 2021. By July, the high school class of 2021 completed 4.8% fewer applications compared to the class of 2020 (National College Attainment Network, 2021). This translates into 102,000 fewer students portending lower enrollment in fall 2021. Not only did COVID-19 impact enrollments, but it also impacted the mental health of the students. The annual Beginning College Survey of Student Engagement (BCSSE) indicated that 53% of the students experienced an increase in mental and emotional health issues (Carrasco, 2021). The American Council on Education's 2021 fall Pulse Point Survey indicates that college and university presidents across the board were concerned about the increase in students' mental health issues. Seventy-three percent of the presidents at 2-year institutions considered students' mental health as the most pressing issue followed by concerns for a decrease in enrollment (Melidona, Taylor, and McNamee, 2021).

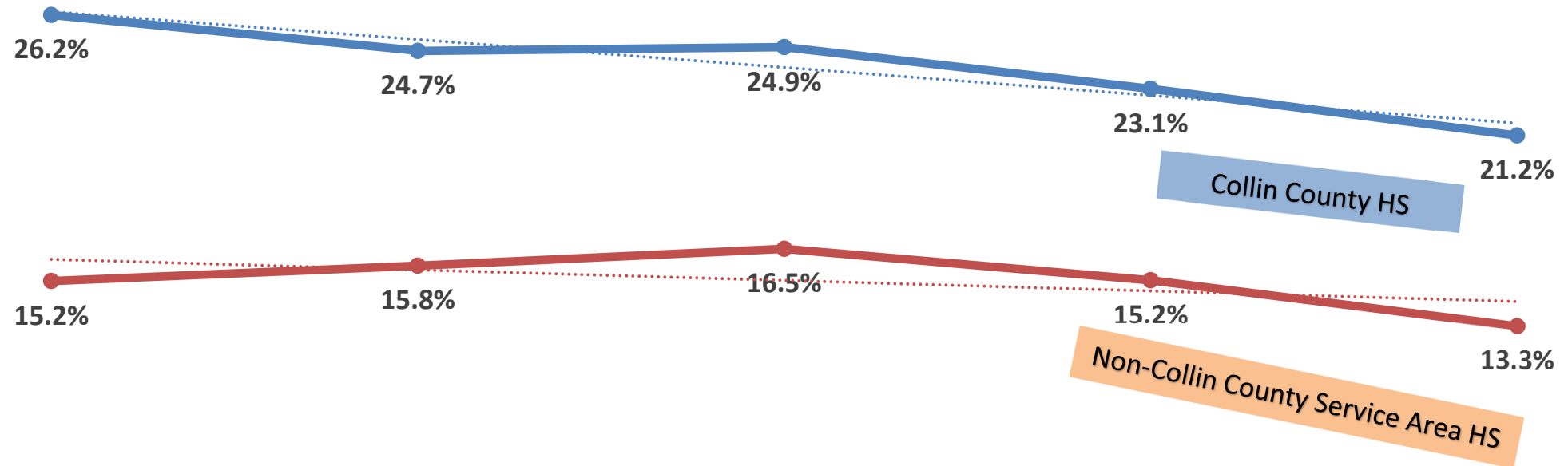

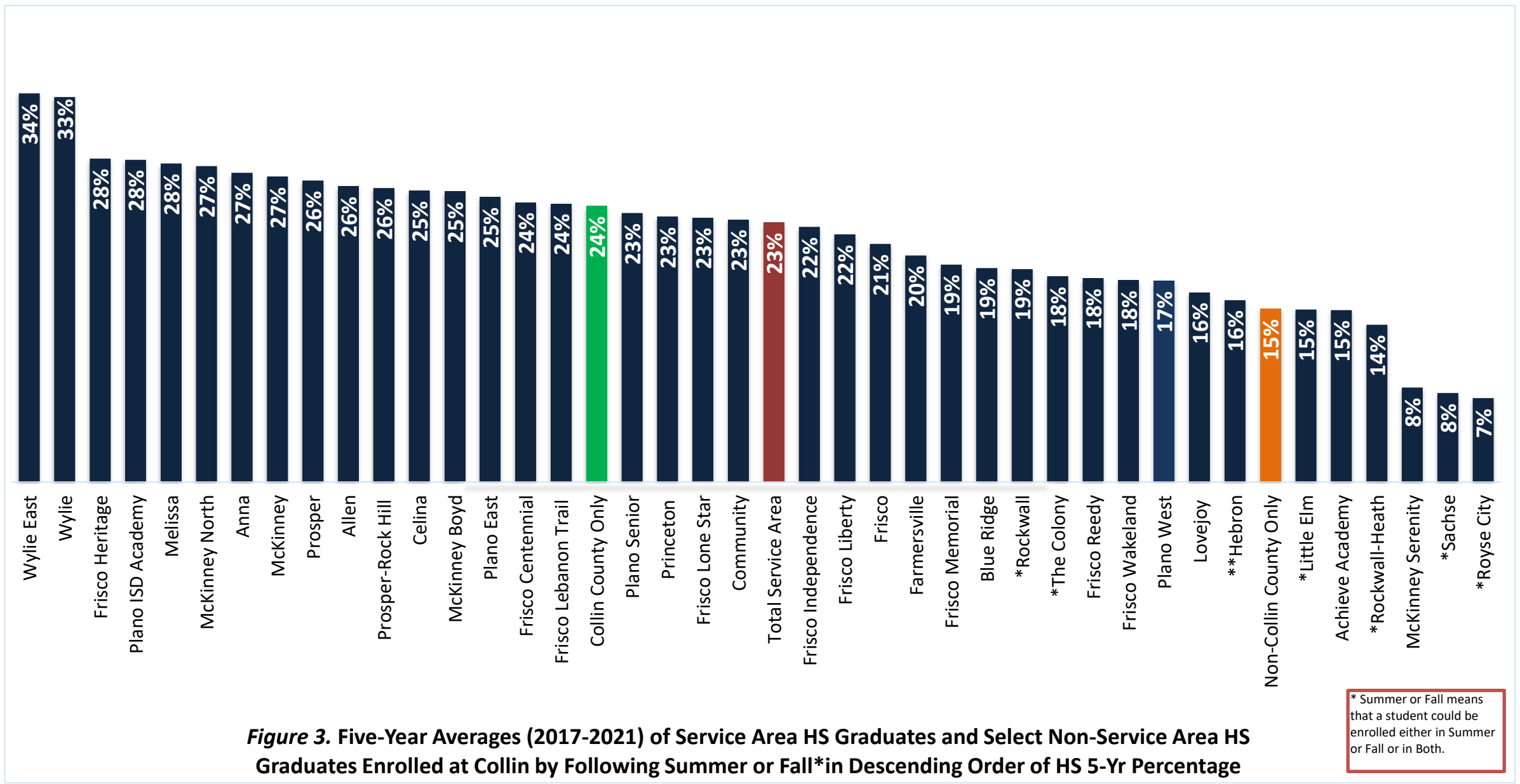
